8VI Appendix 4C & Quarterly Activity Report

22 January 2021, Singapore

8VI Holdings Limited ("8VI" or the "Group") releases its cash flow report for the quarter ended December 2020 (Appendix 4C) and provides an update on the key areas of activity during the quarter ended 31 December 2020.

- The Group continues to ride on the tailwinds of changing consumer habits brought on by the resurgence of the COVID-19 pandemic regionally, driving the sale and subscription of VI App and its range of online financial educational programmes through VI College.
- For VI App, the acquisition and retention rates maintained an overall healthy growth in users, page views and subscribers in the current quarter. The key performance indicators for VI App are as shown in the table below:

- For VI College, total number of graduates for the quarter stands at 5,563, up 3.6% as compared to 5,368 in the previous quarter. The year-to-date (Q1 to Q3 FY2021) total number of graduates were 17,906, up 498% as compared to 2,997 in the previous corresponding period (Q1 to Q3 FY2020).
- The results are in line with the Company's observation of the extended period of recovery expected across the region with the progress of the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Revenue (unaudited) stands at S\$6.3 million in third quarter FY2021, up 152% as compared to S\$2.5 million in third quarter FY2020. The year-to-date (Q1 to Q3 FY2021) unaudited revenue were S\$17.7 million, up 153% as compared to S\$7.0 million in the previous corresponding period (Q1 to Q3 FY2020).



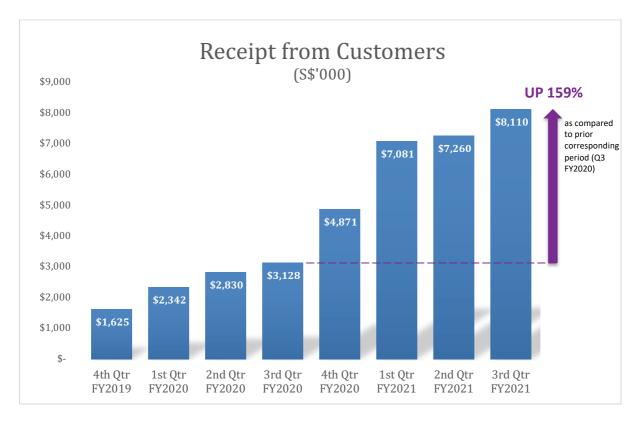


Table 2 Cash Receipts from Customers

- Cash receipts from customers for the December 2020 quarter were S\$8.1 million, up 159% as compared to S\$3.1 million in third quarter FY2020. The year-to-date (Q1 to Q3 FY2021) cash receipts from customers were S\$22.5 million, up 170% as compared to S\$8.3 million in the previous corresponding period (Q1 to Q3 FY2020).
- Cash flows from operating activities for the December 2020 quarter were S\$3.3 million, up 333% as compared to cash inflows from operating activities of S\$0.8 million in third quarter FY2020. The year-to-date (Q1 to Q3 FY2021) cash flows from operating activities were S\$11.6 million, up 469% as compared cash inflows from operating activities of S\$2.0 million in the previous corresponding period (Q1 to Q3 FY2020).
- Free cash flows for the December 2020 quarter were S\$1.7 million, up 49% as compared to free cash flows of S\$1.2 million in third quarter FY2020. The year-to-date (Q1 to Q3 FY2021) free cash flows were S\$9.1 million, up 293% as compared to free cash flows of S\$2.3 million in the previous corresponding period (Q1 to Q3 FY2020).



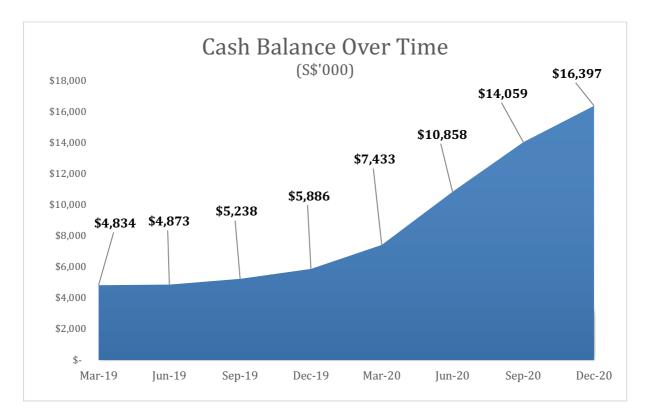


Table 3 Cash Balance Over Time

• Cash on hand as of 31 December 2020 was S\$16.4 million, an increase of S\$2.3 million over the previous quarter.

Related Party Payments:

• During the quarter, the Company made payments of S\$436 thousand to related parties and their associates. These payments relate to the existing remuneration agreements.

In conclusion, the Board and Management maintain cautious optimism on the performance of the Group and will continue to respond to the changing conditions in ensuring that 8VI remain well positioned to navigate the extraordinary circumstances and global environment.
